# Hawaii Island Itinerary

Because Hawaii Island is so big (it takes roughly 3 hours and 15 minutes to get from Kona Airport to <u>Hawaii Volcanoes National Park</u>), it's best to plan your itineraries by location. Below you'll find seven days of itinerary suggestions. Choose your itinerary depending on where you're staying and the length of stay.

# Day 1: Historic Kailua Village (Kailua-Kona) and Keauhou

Lively <u>Historic Kailua Village (Kailua-Kona)</u> is the heart of the <u>Kona</u> Coast featuring a variety of hotels, shops and restaurants lining Alii Drive. But Kailua Village is also an incredibly historic area, home to <u>Hulihee Palace</u>, Mokuaikaua Church and Ahuena Heiau, all within walking distance of each other. Look into the past just north of Kailua-Kona at Kaloko-Honokohau National Historical Park, a place to learn about early Hawaiian culture. Take a <u>surfing</u> lesson or go <u>snorkeling</u> at Kahaluu Beach and other <u>beaches</u> in the Kailua Village and <u>Keauhou</u> resort areas. After a beautiful Kona sunset, enjoy <u>nightlife</u> along Alii drive with great food and <u>live music</u>. For the more adventurous, go on an unforgettable night-dive with <u>manta rays</u>.

## Day 2: South Kona and Beyond

Visit <u>Puuhonua o Honaunau National Historical Park</u> to step back in time and learn about early Hawaiian culture. Kealakekua Bay is a Marine Life Conservation District popular with snorkelers and the site of Captain James Cook's death. In fact, south Kona's beaches are a great place for <u>snorkelers</u> because of its calm and clear waters. Tour a Kona <u>coffee farm</u> in south Kona or in the art village of <u>Holualoa</u> and get a sip of 100% Kona Coffee. Then get off the beaten path and take a road trip to <u>Ka Lae (South Point)</u>, the southernmost point in the United States.

#### Day 3: Kohala Coast & North Kohala

See the amazing contrasts between the black lava lined <u>Kohala Coast</u> and lush <u>North Kohala</u>. Start your day in Kohala's fantastic <u>resorts</u> playing <u>golf</u> or indulging in a spa treatment. Then explore historic sites like the <u>Puukohola Heiau National Historical Park</u> and the <u>Lapakahi State Historical Park</u>. Head to the green pastures of <u>Waimea</u> and go<u>horseback riding</u> with an authentic <u>paniolo</u> (Hawaiian cowboy). Then continue driving to lovely <u>Hawi</u> for delicious food and fantastic shopping. Along the way, be sure to visit sites like the <u>King Kamehameha Statue in Kapaau</u> and the breathtaking view from the <u>Pololu Valley Overlook</u>.

#### Day 4: Hamakua Coast

On the northeastern <u>Hamakua Coast</u> of the island, spend the day driving along the <u>Hamakua Heritage Corridor</u> to see amazing scenic views, <u>waterfalls</u> and <u>botanical gardens</u>. Spectacular waterfalls that are easily accessible include <u>Akaka Falls</u> and Rainbow Falls in the <u>Wailuku River State Park</u>. See rare and exotic plants at the <u>Hawaii Tropical Botanical Gardens</u> and the <u>World Botanical Gardens</u>. Stop in Honokaa Town to browse the shops and art galleries. Finally, end your trip with an unforgettable view at the <u>Waipio Valley Lookout</u>.

### Day 5: Volcano and Kau

You can easily spend a day exploring <u>Hawaii Volcanoes National Park</u>. Take a day <u>hike</u> through its miles of trails, see sights like <u>Nahuku (Thurston Lava Tube)</u>, Halemaumau Crater and see lava meet the sea at lookout points at the end of Chain of Craters Road or in nearby <u>Kalapana</u>. Beyond the park, take a trip to <u>Punaluu Black Sand</u> <u>Beach</u> in <u>Kau</u> to feel black sand between your toes.

## Day 6: Hilo Side

The lush <u>Hilo</u> side of Hawaii Island will be your home base for your visit to <u>Hawaii</u> <u>Volcanoes National Park</u>. Nearby you'll find a variety of off-the-beaten-path discoveries. Visit the <u>Puna</u> area to find charming restaurants shops and amazing sights like <u>Lava Trees State Park</u>. You'll also find even more interesting attractions like the Panaewa Rainforest Zoo, <u>Mauna Loa Macadamia Nut Factory</u> and <u>Akatsuka Orchid</u> Gardens.

#### Day 7: Downtown Hilo

Relax and experience the local side of Hawaii Island in <u>Downtown Hilo</u>. Visit incredible <u>museums</u> like the <u>Lyman Museum and Mission House</u>, the <u>Imiloa Astronomy Center of Hawaii</u>, the <u>East Hawaii Cultural Center</u>, Mokupapapa Discovery Center and the <u>Pacific Tsunami Museum</u>. <u>Shop</u> at the <u>Hilo Farmers Market</u> and other local favorites to discover off the beaten path treasures. Then unwind in amazing parks like <u>Liliuokalani</u> Gardens after your busy trip to Hawaii Island.
