



## **Oregon's Natural Wonders** Discover the Bounty of the Pacific Northwest

You'll love this northwestern adventure from Pacific coast to the Columbia River Gorge, the high desert to Crater Lake. Meet skilled growers of hazelnuts, seed, and fruit. View stunning mountain vistas, from Mt. Bachelor to famed Mt. Hood. Lunch at the spectacular Timberline Lodge on Mt. Hood, a national landmark built by the Civilian Conservation Corps and WPA during the Thirties. Spend three nights at Sunriver Resort, a planned community at the base of the Cascades, and hear the ocean waves crashing against the shore in historic Newport, "the Dungeness Crab Capital of the world".

Day 1–Portland Welcome to Portland, the beautiful "City of Roses"! Our adventure begins with a private reception at the Monarch Hotel. You'll meet your Discoveries Director, get to know your traveling companions and hear all about the exciting days ahead. *Accommodations:* Monarch Hotel, Clackamus. Welcome Reception.

Day 2–Tillamook Forest/Newport You've seen the packaging at your local grocery store, now get a chance to see up close and personal Bob's Red Mill. The products are manufactured using timehonored techniques, like grinding whole grains at cool temperatures with a traditional stone mill. And, did you know that Oregon grows 99% of all hazelnuts in the United States? Find out all about these delicious nuts at Oregon Orchards. After lunch, we'll continue our way towards the coast. Just over a century ago, this territory was served by stagecoach and home to frontier families. Today, an easy hour's drive west of Portland, the Tillamook State Forest has plenty of stories to tell and special places to explore. The Tillamook Forest Center, an inviting escape nestled in the forest and overlooking the Wilson River, awaits your discovery. We continue along the Oregon coast to Yaquina Head Lighthouse, the region's most photographed lighthouse, before checking into our oceanfront hotel for the evening. *Accommodations:* Shilo Inn, Newport. *Meals:* B, L.

Day 3–Newport/Corvallis/Sisters/Sunriver We'll embark this morning from historic bayfront in Newport on a Discovery cruise of Newport Bay. An ocean naturalist will join us on board to share fascinating tales of the deep and local wildlife, which can range from sea lions and gray whales to pelicans and bald eagles. Leaving the coast, we head inland to Corvallis. the bulk of their produce they use in their restaurant. Then, meet the Venell family, growers of grass seed, peppermint and hazelnuts. Clarence started the farm when he was 18 with just 20 acres; you'll be impressed by how the business has grown today. Later, we make our way through the scenic Willamette National Forest and into the western town of Sisters. You'll have time to stretch your legs and grab an ice cream before continuing on to Sunriver Resort our home for the next three nights. Accommodations: Sunriver Resort, Sunriver. Meals: B, L.

## Day 4–Newberry Volcano/High Desert Museum/Sunriver After

a delicious breakfast, we'll explore one of the natural wonders near our resort. Newbury National Volcanic Monument was created in 1990 to

preserve the lava lands in Central Oregon. You'll visit the Lava Lands area for an up-close look at the obsidian lava fields and learn more about this active volcanic area of the state. Then we'll return to the days of explorers, settlers and buckaroos at the High Desert Museum in Bend. The history of the mountain frontier will come alive as you and your traveling friends explore life-size dioramas of an 1800s settlement...view exhibits of fascinating Western and native art...and see golden eagles, otters and porcupines, maybe even a wild mustang! We'll enjoy lunch in Bend before returning to the resort for an afternoon of leisure. Perhaps you'll rent a bicycle for a leisurely afternoon ride on the miles of bike trails around the property. Or enjoy a swim in the pool. Whatever you do, enjoy your afternoon! *Accommodations:* Sunriver Resort, Sunriver. *Meals:* B, L.

## Day 5–Sunriver Resort/Crater Lake/Deschuttes River

Today is yours to enjoy the resort and all of its amenities. Or, if you'd like, take our optional tour to Crater Lake National Park.

**Option–Crater Lake** Native Americans considered this tranquil blue gem, rimmed by rugged cliffs and soaring peaks, so sacred that they didn't breathe a word of it to European pioneers for half a century. We'll enjoy an excursion around the 33-mile rim, stopping several times to take in the awesome scenery. You'll view enchanting Wizard Island, see the "phantom ship" rock formation and be mesmerized by the deep azure of the water. Later enjoy lunch and more breathtaking water as we overlook Crater Lake. *Price: \$77 per person.* 

This evening, we'll take a leisurely float trip along portions of the Deschuttes River and afterwards enjoy a tasty BBQ dinner. *Accommodations:* Sunriver Resort, Sunriver. *Meals:* B, D.

## Day 6-Mt. Hood/Cascade Locks/Kiyokawa Orchards

Today is full of the sights and sounds and wonderful scents of Oregon. You'll marvel at the beauty of the dramatic, 300-footdeep river canyon, Crooked River Gorge. Next, get ready to ascend majestic Mt. Hood! Our drive up to the timberline



will reveal one spectacular vista after another. We'll enjoy a tasty lunch at Timberline Lodge, a rustic resort built by the WPA craftsmen during the Great Depression. You'll also tour portions of this amazing property with a U.S. Forest Service Ranger. The artistry will astonish you. The Hood River Valley is the "fruit bowl" of Oregon, and no visit would be complete without a stop at Kiyokawa Orchards in Parkdale. You'll have a chance to taste some luscious freshpicked apples and pears at their orchard market. We'll finish our day with a tasty dinner cruise on the spectacular Columbia River Gorge. Accommodations: Best Western Plus Columbia River Inn, Cascade Locks. Meals: B, L, D.

Day 7–Bonneville Dam/Columbia River Gorge This morning, we set off to see the Bonneville Dam. As we explore this engineering wonder, you'll

be amazed by the enormous turbines that generate electricity for the entire region. Fishing is big business here and you'll also get an up-close look at an elaborate hatchery that turns out millions of salmon each year. On to legendary Multnomah Falls. Plummeting 620 feet, it is the second highest year-round waterfall in America. You'll love the magical sight of the exquisite silver stream flying down the mammoth rock face. Our final stop along the gorge is the majestic Crown Point overlook and the Vista House. Built as a rest stop observatory for travelers on the old Columbia River Gorge Highway, the Vista House is a fitting memorial honoring Oregon's pioneers—particularly those who made their way down the Columbia River. *Meals:* B.
