Make time for history at the Old Courthouse Museum. Completed in 1893 with a landmark clock tower, this beautifully restored quartzite building features three floors of permanent and changing interactive historical and science related exhibits.

Tour the elegant 1889 Queen Anne style home of South Dakota's first senator, R.F. Pettigrew. Its detailed woodwork, silk damask wall coverings, jeweled glass windows, and authentic furnishings provide a peek into the life of a turn of the century political family. Daily Guided Tours every hour.

The Museum of Visual Materials is the one of the oldest building in Downtown Sioux Falls, South Dakota (1887). You can learn about the amazing history of the museum and everything it has to offer. The Museum houses over 4,500 books, 1000's of vinyl records and 8-track tapes, yards and yards of fabrics, over 80,000 sewing buttons, all types of arts and crafts, and a marvelous kitchen.
