Visit the world-renowned **Butler Institute of American Art**, the country's first museum dedicated to works created solely by American artists. The docent-led tour will feature artistic treasures spanning a full three centuries.

Next stop at **The Amish Market**, Ohio's first indoor Amish Market. There are over 30 vendors selling their products, including fresh baked goods, homemade cheese and deli, furniture, genuine Amish restaurant, gifts, fresh Butcher shop, fruit and produce, and more.

Enjoy lunch at **Das Dutch Haus** where your group will enjoy wonderful Pennsylvania Dutch-style home cooking, and can browse the restaurant gift shop and bakery. Next, visit **White House Fruit Farm** and enjoy all this fantastic Ohio Century Farm Market has to offer including their famous blueberry donuts! End your day at **Mastropietro Winery** where your group can relax and enjoy wine tastings in their beautiful Tuscan style tasting room. Afterwards, check into one of our many group-friendly hotels. Day Two begins in beautiful Mill Creek MetroParks strolling through lovely **Fellows Riverside Gardens**, a 12-acre public display garden. Next, tour historic **Lanterman's Mill**, a working gristmill constructed in 1846.

Visit the **Youngstown Historical Center (Steel Museum)** for a unique look into the steel industry and how it shaped the Mahoning Valley.
